## 01 Background information

In the Bible (Genesis 9:15), there is a story called Noah’s Ark. This story is about hope and how people can reconnect with God. Noah’s story highlights God’s promise, symbolised by the rainbow, that the world would not be destroyed by floods again. It also connects to Baptism, which represents a new beginning, much like Noah’s fresh start after the flood.

## 02 What should I already know?

You should know that Noah built a big boat to save animals and his family from a flood. You might recognise the rainbow as a special sign from God that the flood would not happen again.

Praise be to God, who made a promise to Noah and gave us the rainbow as a sign of His love. Thank Him for caring for all creation and for guiding us to take care of the world. Glory to God forever and ever.

- Covenant:** A special promise God makes to show His love and care.
- Sin:** When we do something wrong that God doesn’t like.
- Psalm:** A song or prayer in the Bible to talk to and praise God.
- Baptism:** A special ceremony to welcome someone into God’s family.
- Old Testament:** The first part of the Bible with stories about how God created the world and His people before Jesus.
- New Testament:** The second part of the Bible that tells about Jesus and the start of the Christian Church.
