You can use a range of materials including card, paint, paper, straw, lolly sticks etc. We can’t wait to see your designs!</p> 	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>English</u></p> <p>The Great Fire of London started in a bakery on Pudding Lane.</p> <p>Write a recipe for baking bread. Remember to include a title, subheadings and numbering to make the instructions clear. You could include a picture to show people what it should look like at the end.</p> 
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Music</u></p> <p>Learn ‘London’s Burning’.</p> <p>Listen to a round of the song. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=9RkX8WG6HSQ</p> <p>Can you recreate the round with a friend?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>RE: Due on 17th January</u></p> <p>Research the life of St Ignatius. Present your work on A4 paper.
