<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Science</u></p> <p>We are learning about the classification of living things.</p> <p>Can you create your own classification key to identify 8 different animals?</p> <p>Follow the link for some help - https://www.twinkl.co.uk/teaching-wiki/classification-key</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Spanish</u></p> <p>We are learning to order what we would like to eat and drink in a Spanish café</p> <p>Create a simple script in Spanish of placing an order in a Spanish café.</p> <p>Try to order both food and drinks.</p> <p>Consider what questions the waiter would ask, how you would respond, saying please and thank you as well as asking for the bill at the end.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Art</u></p> <p>We are learning about creating 3D abstract and figurative sculpture.</p> <p>One of the artist we will learn about is the British sculptor Anthony Caro.</p> <p>Research his work and recreate one of his sculptures. This could be a 2D drawing or a 3D sculpture.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Writing</u></p> <p>We are learning about non-chronological reports.</p> <p>Create your very own non-chronological report on a mythical monster.</p> <p>This could be one from ancient history, a favourite book or from your imagination.</p> <p>Make sure to include an introduction, topic paragraphs and a summary/conclusion.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>RE:</u></p> <p>We are learning about how Jesus is the servant Messiah.</p> <p>There are many stories of when Jesus chose to heal the sick.</p> <p>Retell one of these stories by: rewriting the story, creating a storyboard, writing a letter from a character's point of view etc.</p>	<p><u>History</u> - <i>How hard was it to invade and settle in Britain?</i></p> <p>We are learning about the period in Britain after the Romans left.</p> <p>Many places in the UK are old Anglo-Saxon settlements. You can tell this by looking at the end of place names.</p> <p>Write a list of UK places that come from Anglo-Saxon names.</p> <p>-bury -ford -ham -leigh/lee/ly -ney -port -ton -wick/wich</p>
